Post-war Puerto Rico: Images

Between 1945 and 1951, Florence Arquin, an American photographer, artist, painter and writer, participated in the "Kodachrome Slide Project", an initiative that was sponsored by the United States State Department. The principal objective of this project was to create a collection of images of Latin American countries that would be utilized in educational projects undertaken by museums, schools and universities in the U.S. in order to educate Americans about the social, cultural, economic and political reality of the region. Thanks to the initiative of then Resident Commissioner Jesús Piñero, Ms. Arquin visited Puerto Rico and captured hundreds of images of daily life on the island. These images were later included in the "Slide Project". During her visit she also offered conferences at the University of Puerto Rico in Río Piedras.

During the months of August and September of this year a selection of these images, currently part of the Piñero Collection, will be exhibited at the UNE's regional centers. The exhibit will offer a glimpse of Puerto Rico during the post World War II era through the eyes of a talented photographer.


