## Donations Strengthen the Piñero Collection


During the past few weeks two valuable and important donations have been made to the Piñero Collection at the Universidad del Este. In August, the projector that was the property of Governor Piñero and was used during his educational campaigns throughout the island of Puerto Rico was donated to the University. The projector is a Bell & Howell "Filmosound Utility" model that was manufactured between 1936 and 1940. Originally the projector was protected by a wooden case. The passage of time and factors such as termites brought about the disappearance of this protective box. The Piñero Collection has plans to restore this machine and to include it in the permanent exhibition on the life and work of Governor Piñero, an exhibition that will be an important part of the future Piñero Library.

The Toste Mediavilla family has also made an important contribution to the Collection. In 1961, the well-known Puerto Rican artist Juan A. Rosado painted a remarkable portrait of Governor Piñero. The work reflects the nobility and serenity that characterized the life of "Don Jesús". Mrs. Nitza Mediavilla is a grand niece of the ex governor.

Juan A. Rosado was born in Toa Alta in 1891 and died in 1961. From his *atalier* in Puerta de Tierra Rosado had a major impact on the artistic world on the island. Although he was a very active and productive artist, many of his Works are not accounted for. Some his paintings can currently be found at the Institute of Puerto Rican Culture and the Museum of History, Art and Anthropology at the University of Puerto Rico in Río Piedras.

## Forum: Description and Preservation of Audio Visual Resources

Several factors combine to make the preservation of film an enormous challenge for those archives and collections who possess these creations. The medium itself, our tropical climate as well as the rapid pace of change in this medium demand that the individuals and institutions who work in the area of film preservation keep up to date with the latest technology and tendencies in this field

On September 14th, the Network of Archives of Puerto Rico (*Red de Archivos de Puerto Rico*, ArchiRED), with the collaboration of the UNE, sponsored a forum on this important topic. The four speakers who made presentations at the event talked about: the archival description of film material, the preservation of film, the organization and conservation of university audio visual collections, and the work being done in Latin America to preserve and make known the continent's film heritage. ### Public Relations and Electoral Processes in Puerto Rico: Past and Present

The fascinating history of the role of public relations in Puerto Rico's electoral processes was the principal topic of a lively conversation held in the Piñero Reading Room on the 26th of September. Dr. Nereidín Feliciano spoke about the many ways in which publicity and public relations have impacted the campaigns of individuals, political parties and other organizations during the 20th and 21st centuries.

Dr. Feliciano began her presentation with an analysis of the work of the young Luis Muñoz Marín as he entered the world of politics and journalism. His experiences, as the son of Luis Muñoz Rivera, his work at the newspaper *La Democracia*, his collaboration with Santiago Iglesias Pantín and the Socialist Party, all contributed to his profound knowledge of the strategies, pitfalls and possibilities of publicity and public relations.

During this extended conversation, the participants paid particular attention to the political campaigns of 1968. The innovative use of images, jingles, slogans and other devices made this electoral process a very unique experience in Puerto Rican political history. Several possible topics for future investigations were highlighted during the discussion. Part of the discussion was dedicated to contrasting the terms publicity and public relations as well as the public's perception of the work of the agencies in charge of the public image of political figures and parties.
