Documentary from the Piñero Library



After a very long wait, the Piñero Library has at last received the first copies of the documentary Geografía de la memoria: Canóvanas en tiempos de don *Jesús.* This production is the fruit of a collaborative effort that included the Piñero Collection of the UNE, the Municipality of Canóvanas and the Institute of Puerto Rican Culture through the Piñero House Museum. In this production, three major topics are woven together to present the life of Governor Piñero, his residence, or "casa rosada", and everyday life in the region during the decades of 1930, 40 and 50. The documentary includes interviews with historians, the architect who was in charge of the restoration of Piñero House, the Governor's son, as well as a dozen residents of the area, contemporaries of Piñero, who bring to life the cultural patterns of a small sugar cane town in the first half of the 20th century.
